


## **Junior Report**

The Junior Subcommittee failed to supply a report for 2013 in time for publication in this Annual Report. Therefore to ensure that the members of Woonona Shamrocks Rugby Club have some record of Junior activity in 2013 the following was compiled by myself in my capacity as Club Secretary.

The club entered Junior teams in the IDRU U7's, <u>U</u>8, U9, U10, U11, U13, U14, U15, U17 age groups. With assistance of some dedicated parents each team was able to compete effectively and all had some modicum of success in 2013. All teams tried hard this season, with 5 teams making it into the Semi-Final series. The U11's and the U14's both finished 4<sup>th</sup> on the ladder, making the Minor Semi-Finals. That was as far as they went with both losing

in closely contested games. The U13's finished 2<sup>nd</sup> and unfortunately lost the Major Semi-Final and then the Preliminary Final in successive weeks to miss out on a Grand Final berth.

The standout team of the year was our Under 15's. They were effectively coached by Steve Arthurs and Grahame Tresidder and had a great Manager in Granddad, Barry Aylett. The encouragement and discipline administered in training at Ocean Park saw the 15's as the dominant team in this division all year, taking out the Minor premiership. But as we all know that accounts for little once a team gets into the final series where anything can happen. That was the case this year where Campbelltown provided some very stiff opposition in the Grand Final and it was a nail biter right down to the whistle. Either team could have won but it was our glorious Shamrocks that were victorious and declared true IDRU U15 2013 Premiers. The U17's also had a great year taking out the Minor Premiership and making the Grand Final, again against Campbelltown. While the Shamrock 17's had had good wins against Campbelltown during the previous games in the season the 'rub of the green' went against us in the Grand Final which saw Campbelltown the winners and taking out the premiership.



Over the year's Shamrocks have had many representative players at District and Country level but only a handful have been selected at the elite level of a NSW State representative. This year it has come as no surprise to those that know that our U15 and U17 Shamrock Juniors have had a combined total of 6 players selected in their respective NSW Junior sides.

The Shamrock Juniors selected in the NSW U15 side are Liam Rash – a rangy second rower, Blake Schoupp – hooker and Brendon Neville – a strong No. 8. All are in the 'engine room' and their combination

Our Juniors are a relatively strong club and I know from experience there are a lot of enthusiastic parents that get down and support the boys on the field. That support is also evident around the ground on game day in the canteen and at the BBQ. Without the parent support that we see all the time the club would not function as well as it does. The Senior Club look to the Juniors as the future of the Shamrocks and that is the reason that we have such a strong club. The emphasis has always been and always will be on 'growing your own'. We see Woonona Shamrocks as a way young Rugby Players can get a taste of the game, be coached correctly and be given an opportunity to display their Rugby talent. ## **Treasurers Report**

After we experienced some real financial challenges in 2012 with a significant reduction in Sponsorship revenues and increased costs it is pleasing to report that we have had a much better year in 2013. This turnaround is very pleasing and a reflection of the hard work of many of our club members and committee in 2013. It has been a real team effort here with a lot of members pitching in and putting that little bit extra effort in to ensure that as a club we could "stay afloat" financially and be sustainable into the future. It was typical of what this club is all about, so a big thank you to the committee and all the club members that worked hard during the year.

We were successful in getting a new major sponsor on board in Access Law Group so thanks to Tom Ellicott and Graham Lancaster for coming on board and they have confirmed that they will again be on board in 2014 which is great news for our club. Bellambi Hotel who have supported us for years continue to be a major sponsor as well so our appreciation goes to Brendon and the Hotel Team we really appreciate this ongoing support. Our minor sponsorships (fence signage) increased also through 2013 which was pleasing so when compared to 2013 we can go into the 2014 season with more confidence that we at least have some good sponsorship revenue helping to cover our ever increasing costs.

The other financial highlights for the year were good revenue raised though hosting the Illawarra dog show in February, some good revenue from home preseason trials, the Club Membership auction, hosting of the Yorkshire Terriers game, the Sportsman's Luncheon, opening the bar on a Thursday night for post training drinks and the Hosting of the Final. These events all contributed significantly to our income throughout the year. The

Sportsman's Luncheon was again this year our biggest individual revenue raiser netting the club just over \$10k in profit. So thank you to Grahame, Terry, Steve, Marilyn & Vaughan for their efforts with this event.

Hall hire revenue was also good during the year and this is another aspect of the clubs activities that will be important to continue to grow and represents some great opportunity for the club to increase revenue here. Thank you to Lorrell (Luvvy), for her hard work with this during the year. As in previous years a big thank you goes to Terry our Assistant Treasurer and to Marilyn our Canteen manager for their financial management assistance during the year. Between them they looked after the day to day tasks of banking, reconciling etc, essential for the sound financial management and accurate reporting for the club. So thank you for your efforts here it is really appreciated.

In summary 2013 has been a successful year for us financially and through this we have been able to build our investment account up to just over \$40k. This account has been set up as a Capital Expense account to ensure that we have monies to cover any unforseen major expense. It also maximises our interest revenue while we have this sitting in this interest bearing account, so hopefully we can continue to grow this account to help underpin our club financially into the future. I will cover off in more detail the various expense related items and revenue streams and their trends on a year by year comparison at our AGM as there is not the space to do this in the context of this report.

While 2013 has been pleasing financially there are still major challenges ahead for our club in 2014 and beyond. Addressing the increased cost burdens being placed on us, securing new major and hopefully long term sponsors as well as exploring more avenues where we can raise additional revenues will ensure we have a strong and viable club well into the future. So we will need to continue the hard work to ensure we achieve this.

These procedures have been undertaken for form an opinion as to whether or not, in all material respects, the statement is presented fairly in accordance with applicable Australian Accounting Standards so as to present a view of the Club that is consistent with my understanding of its financial position and cash flows. The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis:

It is not practicable for the club to establish accounting control over all sources of income prior to receipt by the club and accordingly it is not possible for my audit examination to include audit procedures to extend beyond the amounts of income recorded by the club.

## Ground Coordinator Report Season 2013

Again no lives were lost and no injuries reported during this season. The Final Fifteen Crew has been very busy over the year maintaining the ground and surrounds to the highest standards. We have been able to maintain an acceptable playing surface throughout the year, despite only having one field. We are faced with a very difficult task to keep the field 'playable' when it is used for training (days and nights, juniors and seniors throughout the week), game days on Saturdays and Sundays as well as been hired out for a variety of events. The field cops a pounding and it is a credit to the Final Fifteen that they are able to keep the field in as good a condition that is presented to the players each week.

It takes about \$10,000 to repair, maintain and upgrade the field in the "off season" in preparation for the following season. We have a very limited amount of time to "recover" the playing surface in this "off season". Nature is given a hand with watering, fertilizing, aerating and top dressing but it still takes months for the grass to re-establish itself and produce a surface suitable to start the season all over again. This means that as soon as the footy season finishes the Ground Crew is put into action and we work all through the summer to bring the field back to its best.
