President's Report 2014

During 2014 Shamrocks Rugby Club continued to improve in many areas and in some areas 2014 can be viewed as a success while efforts will be required in others. The Senior Club featured 4 teams in the Competition this year. On the field, our grade teams were going well until mid-season but as the tables tell, we ended without a Finals slot. The individual grade reports tell their respective stories and we did see our Colts claim the Minor Premiership, but regrettably fall short at the final hurdle. The hope is that these juniors will remain with the Club as seniors or at the least have fond memories of their time with the Club.

Whilst other Clubs seek to gain allegiance with rewards of monetary incentives, we aim to develop aspirations amongst our club to aim high, using the pathway we are developing for them, and all those players at Shamrocks who have ambitions. That doesn't mean we fail to recognise the fact that some players require assistance in some form; notably assistance with education and employment opportunities so that is where our efforts are directed. Off the field the primary objective continues to be the pursuit of revenue to ensure we continue to operate and grow our Club, field well presented and prepared teams and plan for the future.

With the help of the Wollongong City Council staff and local State Member for Keira, Ryan Park (now a firm supporter of Shamrocks Rugby), some significant restoration of the Club has been achieved. We also owe a debt of gratitude to our sponsors, and the Thursday Crew, both significant in-kind sponsors, for the work and materials given to us in the improvement of facilities. The financial position of the Club is relatively strong. Assisted by the great success of the Sportsman's Lunch and continuing support of our Major Sponsor, Access Law Group, and also other major contributors, Bellambi Hotel, Step into Life and Bellambi Bowling Club. The financial assistance received from sponsors ensures we continue to operate a rugby club and have resources to improve. Without this generosity the Club would not exist. I'd like to take this opportunity to remind one and all that without the continuous support of the contributing members of the Club (the players), we will struggle not only to raise the necessary monies to continue, but to also attract volunteers to act on committees and sub-committees.

The lifeblood of any club are volunteers - committee, coaches, managers, fund-raisers, canteen and barbecue stalwarts, medical staff and supporters. Thank you all for your efforts especially to those who turn up year after year. The Management Committee have worked

tirelessly to generate income, retain costs and make decisions in the interests of the club. All committee members donate time as volunteers despite having jobs and businesses to attend to. Without the extraordinary efforts of these people and the continued work of other volunteers we wouldn't have a functioning club, however people have a limit and without more volunteers at all levels, particularly to serve on the committee, and as coaches and managers, we are in danger of losing the main contributors to the well-being of the club.

On my own behalf, and on behalf of members and supporters, thank you volunteers for the work you have done to further the objectives of the club. Let us hope there are others who will generously give of their time, who will step up and lighten the load. My personal thanks again to the support and commitment of all of the Management Committee. The Club remains financially solid, we retain a talented playing group across the board, led by our experienced coaches, the Committee work together as a team to achieve agreed to goals for the Club, and whilst our challenges will always continue to be formidable, we can all look forward to the future with confidence. Bring on 2015.

Treasurers Report

2014 was another challenging year for the club financially as increases in general costs as well as trying to get 4 sides on the paddock meant reasonable increases to our player costs this year also. It is pleasing therefore to report that as at the end of the 2014 financial year we are in a relatively healthy state financially.

We experienced growth in our sponsorship revenues through our majors sponsors Access Law Group, Bellambi Bowling Club and Bellambi Hotel continued with their normal support for our club. So a big thank you to Tom, Graham and the team at Access, Brendon and the team at Bellambi Hotel and Garry and his team at Bellambi Bowling Club as these organisations support have been critical for us. We were also successful in securing additional fence signage sponsors during the year and these all had a positive impact on our revenues as did the continued use of our facilities by Step Into Life and Probus.

The financial highlights for the year were the great results we achieved through the revenue raised by hosting the Illawarra dog show in February. The Sportsman's Luncheon was again an outstanding result with a little over \$10k being raised and hosting of the IDRU Finals games which were very profitable for our club. So thanks must go again this year to our Sportsman's Luncheon organising committee – Grahame, Terry, Steve, Marilyn & Vaughan. There is a lot of work that goes into making this event successful and without all of your hard work we would not achieve the outstanding results year in year out that we do with this event. A thank you to everyone that helped out with the Dog Show and IDRU Finals also as these were successful only due to the hard work of many helpers.

Other highlights financially were building our investment account up to a balance of just over \$50k from \$40k last year while maintaining a reasonably healthy balance in our working account. This was one of my main objectives as Treasurer when coming into this role so it is pleasing to report that we have done this, as it gives us a healthy buffer against any unforeseen expenses while returning good interest in this account while we continue to grow this. We were also able to pay our contribution to the new fence erected on the Northern and Eastern sides of the grounds out of our working account, without leaving the club short of funds for day to day expenses. Receiving a Government Grant to assist with this capital expense was also a significant achievement for the club and thanks must go to Steve Saywell here for all of his hard work in putting the Grant application in and then doing a full and proper evaluation of fencing options and proposals before going with the fence that we now have. This fence has really lifted the appearance of our facility and hopefully we will be in a position in the short term to complete the fence to the full perimeter.

As always our canteen revenue was a mainstay for us. Marilyn and the canteen crew as well as the BBQ team do an excellent job every home game to provide without doubt the best provisions and service of any club in the district. We are extremely lucky to have such a group of willing workers that turn up rain, hail or shine to make every home game a

successful and enjoyable one for the club. So well done to Marilyn and the Canteen team and Cav, Terry and the BBQ team for another big year. Lorrell (Luvvy) continued here good work with the hall hire as part of our club's revenue raising endeavours. This is a job that really gets taken for granted as no one sees this aspect of work unless they have some sort of involvement with an event. I have now witnessed firsthand the work involved in this aspect of our club over the last 2 years and it can be very time consuming and at times thankless and dirty work as cleaning halls, toilets etc. after functions is not my idea of an ideal job. So thanks Lorrell for all your hard work here. Lorrell has lifted our presentation and professionalism at these events and we constantly receive great feedback after events.

My role as Treasurer has been made so much easier again this year by the hard work of 2 people in particular. I could not therefore submit a report without personally thanking both. Terry our Assistant Treasurer handles all of the daily transactions of the club and the collating of the information for our financial reports so thanks again for all your work here Terry. Thanks also to Marilyn our Canteen manager who runs the canteen and all aspects of the finances associated with the canteen diligently and professionally. There is a lot of work that goes into this and I really appreciate Marilyn's efforts here. This part of our club is really a well run business under Marilyn's management.

I will cover off in more detail the various expense related items and revenue streams and their trends on a year on year comparison at our AGM as there is not the space to do this in the context of this report.

While 2014 has been reasonably pleasing financially we will need to continue the hard work in constantly looking for more ways to raise revenue to compensate for the ever increasing costs associated with putting our sides on the paddock each year. I look forward to these challenges in 2015 and beyond. We have a great club let's all work hard at making it a greater club into the future (and having a lot of fun while we do it)!!

Ground Coordinator Report

Season 2014

It's that time of the year when you have to report whether you have done your job that you have nominated yourself for the year, 2013-2014. With the help of the people below we have accomplished many things during the past 12 months. Ongoing maintenance to the grounds, coring the field, topdressing, returfing significant areas of the field, fertilising and watering the field to get the cover we require and help the field recover from a hectic season of continual use. All this promotes significant grass growth and mowing becomes a twice weekly job during the Spring and Summer months.

A new fence has been erected on two sides of the field to replace the old fence that was passed its use by date and beyond repair. Thanks must go to Steve Saywell and Terry Nutt for their efforts in identifying an opportunity and obtaining a NSW Government grant that contributed half the funds to complete this project. The balance of the funding came from club funds and "in kind" value from the efforts of the Final Fifteen and Vaughan Judd's company, Malia Plumbing. Vaughan donated his company's equipment and manpower to dig over 100 fence post holes in the near concrete like ground on the fence perimeter. The Final Fifteen crew disassembled the old fence, remediated the ground disturbed removing the old fence and took all the scrap away. This saved the club over \$10,000 in costs that we would have had to pay for if not for the effort of these volunteers. Steve Saywell has prepared and submitted Grant applications for the completion of the remaining two sides of the fence and also a new proposal to replace our non compliant lighting that is costing a "bomb" to main in repair and replacement costs.

A new scrum machine shed is half completed. It has been stalled by one of our neighbours who made a complaint to Council. Apparently we need to complete a DA for this small erection and Council has ordered us to stop work on this shed until the correct paper work is completed.

The ground is coming along fine since the end of the season. 5,000 screws have been replaced on the roof - corrosion of anything metal is a continual problem for us as we are so close to the ocean. This is a tedious back breaking job, again being done by our Final Fifteen Crew. Maintenance to the club structures is ongoing with painting, cleaning, repairing or replacing roller doors and anything that has worn or is broken through wear or other actions. Many thanks to Ken and Anne Phillis for their gardening skills that have rejuvenated the garden around "The Rocks" - well done!

As I stated at the beginning of this report it's not all about me. The Final Fifteen Crew consists more than 15 volunteers, we are lucky enough to even have reserves! The Club is grateful for the efforts of these volunteers and the club would not be the same without them. Thanks to Ken and Anne Phillis, Steve and Marilyn Saywell, Mick Walsh, Garth Doyle, Peter Towers, Terry Chessor, Barry Johnston, Rowan Allnutt, Greg Herbert, Terry Nutt, Allan Potter, Mick Traynor, Grahame Tresidder, Brian Bradley and myself.

A very big thankyou to Max Hobbs and Tony Crewe for their continued support in the supply of fuel for our mowers and trimmers. This becomes a major cost for the club in the off season as we keep the fields maintained. We are always on the lookout for any assistance

we can get and if anyone would like to offer help please contact me on 0402553990. If anyone has suggestions on how we can improve the ground or the club regarding maintenance issues please contact me on the number above or catch me on the BBQ during the pre-season trials or footy season or come down any Thursday morning - we'll be there doing our job.
