Treasurers Report

2015 has been a difficult year both on and off the field for our club. Every year we face the challenge of raising enough money to put at least 3 seniors sides on the field and keep our great facilities at Ocean Park in top condition so that our players and supporters can get maximum benefit and enjoyment from these. Our club is no different from any other organisation in having to deal with continually rising costs and 2015 was no different in this respect.

Added to these rising costs we faced another major financial challenge when our annual Sportsman's Luncheon could not get enough support to allow us to hold the function this year. This function has been a major revenue raiser for many years, which has over the last few years added at least \$10,000 + into the clubs funds. Not having this has really impacted our overall revenues for the year. The other significant disappointment from my perspective as Treasurer was the constant battle to get players fees during the year. This is an annual challenge but it seemed to be worse this year. I think changes imposed by the ARU certainly did not help in this area as well.

We try to keep player fees to an absolute minimum while providing as many resources and facilities as we can, given how competitive it is in attracting players so it would be nice if this was appreciated a little more with players paying these fees early in the season and in full.

On a more positive note a big thank you to our major sponsors this year in Access Law Group, Bellambi Bowling Club and Bellambi Hotel. We really appreciate the ongoing support these organisations give us, so thank you to Tom at Access, Brendon at Bellambi Hotel and Garry at Bellambi Bowling Club for your continued support. With the ongoing revenues we receive from Step Into Life and Probus these give us that certainty around our base revenues that is essential for any organisation.

We are always on the lookout for more sponsors however, so any lead on potential sponsorships would be greatly appreciated.

The financial highlights for the year were again the great results we achieved through the revenue raised by hosting the Illawarra dog show in February and hosting of the IDRU Finals games which were very profitable for our club. A big thank you to everyone that helped out with the Dog Show and IDRU Finals also as these were successful only due to the hard work of many helpers.

Another highlight financially was receiving a further State Government Grant to assist with the completion of our fence project. This grant was matched on a \$ for \$ basis by the council and will therefore allow us to complete our fence on the Southern and Western sides of the ground. Thanks must go to Steve Saywell here for all his work in obtaining these grants and keeping council honest with their commitment on this project. A great effort, thanks Steve. Thanks also to Vaughan Judd for his contribution here of getting all the post holes dug for

us. This is one of the major aspects of the work and this support really helps us.

This club is really blessed with a wonderful Canteen and Ground crew. Again this year our canteen revenue was a mainstay for us. Marilyn and the canteen crew as well as the BBQ team do an excellent job every home game and the facilities and variety offered are I believe, one of the major reasons we continually are successful in winning our tenders for Finals games each year. Thank you to Marilyn and everyone involved here, there are just too many to mention which is a great position to be in. Our Club really is one of the lucky ones in respect of the willing workers who continually contribute their free time in helping make Shamrocks a great place, with great facilities.

Another great effort from Lorrell with the hall hire and the work she has put in to make our Club attractive to those looking for a function venue should be applauded. We consistently get very positive feedback from people who have hired our facility which is a reflection of the hard work put into make these events run well for our Clients.

Again a big thank you to our Assistant Treasurer Terry Nutt who always does the hard work involved in the treasurer's role. With me commuting to Sydney for work every day I doubt I could fulfil the role adequately without Terry's ongoing support. This allows me to be more a Financial Manager for the club rather than Treasurer as Terry covers most of the day to day responsibilities associated with this role. Thanks Nutty.

I will cover off in more detail the various expense related items and revenue streams and their trends on a year on year comparison at our AGM as there is not the space to do this in the context of this report.

In summary I believe the Club has some significant financial challenges ahead. We will really need to review all aspects of the Club (both in seniors and juniors), to ensure we have a sustainable and positive future ahead. There is a lot of work to do, but I am sure we will be up to these challenges. I am looking forward to continuing with my contribution to the club in 2016 and beyond, and having a lot of fun doing it along the way!!
