We do try to keep these player costs to a minimum but really need whatever fee we set paid as quickly as possible in the season to help our cash flows and ensure we can pay our bills when they are due.

Our Sponsors are a very important part of our club as without them we could not operate. I would like to express a big thank you to our major sponsors this year in Access Law Group, Andrew Webb Family & Business Accounting, Bellambi Bowling Club, Bellambi Hotel and Redlam. We really appreciate the ongoing support these organisations give us, so thank you to Tom at Access Law Group, Webbie, Brendon at Bellambi Hotel, Garry at Bellambi Bowling Club and Rick Jones from Redlam (who became involved this year), for your support and hopefully this will continue for many years to come. With the ongoing revenues we receive from our Signage Sponsors, Step Into Life and Probus these give us that certainty around our base revenues that is essential for any organisation. Although we are lucky to have this loyal group of Sponsors we would welcome anyone who is interested in becoming a Sponsor of our great club. We can certainly offer a lot to any potential Sponsor as we are a very prominent part of the Illawarra sporting community, particularly in the Northern Suburbs

The major financial highlights for the year (apart from the previously mentioned Cross-Fit tournament), were again the great results we achieved through the revenue raised by hosting the Illawarra Dog Show in February and hosting of the IDRU Finals games which were well run events for our club. A big thank you to everyone that helped out with the Dog Show and IDRU Finals also as these were successful only due to the hard work of many helpers.

Again this year our canteen revenue was a mainstay for us. Without doubt we are the standout club in the Illawarra in respect of our Canteen and BBQ facilities and continue to offer quality value for money food and refreshments on game day. We are constantly complimented on this. Marilyn and the canteen crew as well as the BBQ team do an excellent job every home game. Thank you to Marilyn and everyone involved here, you all do us proud every home game. Lorrell has again this year done a great job with the hall hire and we have seen the results of her efforts reflected in the increased revenues in this area of our Club's Operations. This year she received a lot of support from Julie Heycott as well so thanks to Julie for all your efforts here.

This year saw us begin to implement the financial recommendations of our Club Auditor - Andrew Webb as passed at last year's AGM. Our most significant accomplishment towards these was the consolidation of our bank accounts to one Institution the IMB, under the control of the designated Club Treasurer. Previously these were held under 2 separate controlling entities being Seniors and Juniors which was not in accordance with the constitution nor best practice financial management processes for our club. While there is still some way to go in the continuing improvement of our financial management practices this was a huge step in the right direction.

My thanks to our Assistant Treasurer Terry Nutt who does most of the hard work involved and is very thorough. Terry is across most aspects of our Club's operations and really is a great club member, so thanks Terry for another great year. I would also like to thank Sandra Fenukitau our Juniors Assistant Treasurer for her support with all things in respect of the Juniors accounts. In some aspects it was difficult this year with the consolidation of the accounts but Sandra was always helpful and supportive and I really appreciated her involvement and input here.

I will cover off in more detail the various expense related items and revenue streams and their trends in the attached financial statements on a year on year comparison at our AGM, as there is not the space to do this in the context of this report.

So in summary 2016 has been an enjoyable and successful year for us in many ways. We still have some significant financial challenges ahead though, so there is still a lot of hard work to do. I look forward to facing these challenges with your support and to an even more successful and enjoyable year in 2017.

RE: 2016 FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND AUDIT REPORT WOONONA SHAMROCKS RUGBY CLUB ('the Club')

Please find enclosed a copy of the Club's 2016 Financial Statements and Audit report, prepared in accordance with the information provided by yourself and the assistant treasurer.

I also take this opportunity to make the following comments in relation to the 2016 Financial Statements:

- For most sporting clubs, success on the field usually translates to financial success off the field. The 2016 financial results demonstrate this relationship quite clearly. Player registration, canteen sales, sponsorship etc. all improved measurably from the previous year.
- These additional finances were largely reinvested into better equipment and facilities including a new scoreboard, perimeter fence, playing equipment etc.
 This capital expenditure will benefit the club for many years and, I believe, is a prudent way for clubs to manage excess funds for the benefit of their members.
- 2016 saw the amalgamation of funds previously held by the juniors in separate bank accounts not controlled by the Treasurer. The current legal structure of the club is such that there is a single executive and a single Treasurer. The Treasurer has specific responsibility for the club's funds as a whole, and is accountable to the club's members for the club's funds, as a whole. The previous separation of funds between juniors and seniors did not align with the club's structure. This amalgamation therefore was, I believe, a sound move by the club's executive and should provide for improved risk management and decision making ability going forward.
- Overall, I believe that the club is in a strong financial position, with a healthy balance of funds on hand. This healthy position is attributed to the strong stewardship of the current and previous executive committees.
