Treasurer's Report 2017-18

As forecast in my 2017 report, 2018 has been a challenging year financially for the club. 2018 saw the club record a negative (\$42,807) in earnings, with total equity retained in the club dropping from \$161,775 as at the end of FY17 to \$118,969 as at the end of FY18.

While this is a significant amount, the primary reason for this was the investment the club made in installing a completely new set of lights for our playing field. Our old lights had really passed their used by date and the ongoing maintenance costs associated with these was getting out of hand. The total cost for these lights was \$74,650 which is a very large one off cost, for any amateur club like ours. However, the new lights have certainly enhanced the playing field and improved our training conditions at night, so this has been a very worthwhile and necessary investment made by the club.

Other key areas financially throughout the year include a significant drop in canteen sales (down 24% - \$18,622), a reduction in interest earnings due to the expenditure on the lights which was primarily funded through our investment account. Other areas of note include 2 years of costs (2017 & 2018), for presentation night due to the timing of these and 2 lots of Building Insurance (2018 & 2019) being paid in FY18.

Canteen sales were impacted by no home trials and we were not successful this year in securing an IDRUGA final at the club.

Other assets purchased by the club in 2018 included a defibrillator and a Blower/Vac.

Total government grants received was \$23,375 which included the lights and the defibrillator.

Key events undertaken by the club to help increase our revenue streams again this year included hosting the Wollongong Dog Show, and another Cross-Fit tournament.

Thanks to the regular band of willing workers that make these functions possible and successful. We really are a fortunate club in having the number of volunteers that we have, that are always willing to chip in to lend a hand with these functions.

2018 saw a new revenue raising venture in that we commenced doing some Bunnings BBQ's, so it will be interesting to see how this helps out and hopefully builds over the coming years. I would ask as many club members as possible to help out with these to lighten the load and ensure we can take on as many of these as possible.

Our Sponsors are a very important part of our club as without them we could not operate. I would like to express a big thank you to our major sponsors this year in, Andrew Webb Family & Business Accounting, Bellambi Bowling Club, and Bellambi Hotel & Baimed Physio. We really appreciate the ongoing support these organisations give us. So please support these organisations when and where you can as without these sponsors we could not operate at the level we do and with the great facilities we have.

Although down on 2017 sales our canteen revenue is our biggest source of income and was again a great success this year with a net profit in this area of \$30,841, for the senior's.

Without these earnings each and every year we would certainly not have the great facilities we all enjoy.

It is with an extremely heavy heart this year that I extend a big thank you to Marilyn "Maz" Saywell, who while not the official Canteen Manager; this year again went above and beyond to ensure this area of our operations was another great success. We have all lost a dear friend and club person and to say she will be deeply missed is a huge understatement.

Again a big thank you also to all our Canteen, BBQ and Thursday crew members this year - you are an integral part of our club and your contribution each and every year is significant.

The Juniors canteen unfortunately went backwards this year after a promising turnaround in FY17, with revenue down 21% (\$3,376) but costs up by ~ 36% (\$2,828). So we will need a little more focus again here to ensure we are maximising our opportunities in this area of our operations. The Bulli raffle was down as well.

My thanks to our Assistant Treasurer's Terry Nutt and Jerry Thomas for all their hard work during the year to ensure our finances were properly managed and reported. It has been a pleasure working with you over the course of this year. You have certainly made my job a lot easier through your diligence.

I will cover off in more detail the various expense related items and revenue streams and their trends in the attached financial statements on a year on year comparison at our AGM, and will be happy to answer any questions arising out of these.

I look forward to a successful and enjoyable 2019 for our club both on and off the field.

RE: 2018 FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND AUDIT REPORT
WOONONA SHAMROCKS RUGBY CLUB ('the Club')

Please find enclosed a copy of the Club's 2018 Financial Statements and Audit report, prepared in accordance with the information provided by yourself and the assistant treasurer. I take this opportunity to make the following comments in relation to these reports:

- We note that the Club made a significant capital purchase of new lighting at Ocean Park during the year, offset partially by the receipt of a government grant. We have separated these large 'one-off' items within the Profit & Loss Statement to allow a clearer view of operating income and expenditure;
- We have included a Balance Sheet at 30 September 2018 which presents cash on hand and GST refundable at year end. The club holds significant other assets, player facilities and equipment (and now new lighting). Historically, all purchases of equipment and improvements to facilities have been expensed within the year of purchase. I see no need to alter this practice;
- Other than the lighting purchase, trading results in 2018 were consistent with prior years. There was a material reduction in canteen revenue, largely explainable due to not hosting a seniors semi-final in 2018.

Overall, I believe that the club is in a strong financial position, with a healthy balance of funds on hand. This healthy position is attributed to the strong stewardship of the current and previous executive committees.

I have audited the attached statement of income and expenditure of the Woonona Shamrocks Rugby Club Inc for the period 1 October 2017 to 30 September 2018. The Committee is responsible for the preparation and presentation of the statement and the information contained therein. I have conducted an independent audit of this statement in order to express an opinion on the statement to the members.

My audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the statement is free of material misstatement. My procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the statement. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether or not, in all material respects, the statement is presented fairly in accordance with applicable Australian Accounting Standards so as to present a view of the Club that is consistent with my understanding of its financial position and cash flows.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

Audit Opinion

It is not practicable for the club to establish accounting control over all sources of income prior to receipt by the club and accordingly it is not possible for my audit examination to include audit procedures to extend beyond the amounts of income recorded by the club.

In, my opinion, subject to the limitations imposed by the foregoing, the attached statement of income and expenditure presents fairly in accordance with the applicable Accounting Standards the financial position of the Woonona Shamrocks Rugby Club Inc as at 30 September 2018, and the cash flows for the period then ended.

Grounds Person's Report

From a grounds perspective 2018 a dominating influence on Ocean Park Woonona has been the major drought that has gripped eastern Australia. While the season kicked off with the playing field being in fair condition after extensive watering throughout the hot dry summer, as the growing season came to an end the field conditions began to deteriorate and by season's end there were extensive bare areas and the eastern half of the field was extremely uneven. There was virtually no mowing required after the Easter break, such was the lack of growth on the field.

The Club has been fortunate to have been awarded a Federal Grant of \$10,000 through the Stronger Communities Programme which is to be spent on improving the ground for our milestone 50th Anniversary year. The field has now been cored and weeded and some turf laid. The next step will be top dressing and fertilising in November in the hope of eliminating many of the depressions and bumps particularly on the eastern side of the field. Unfortunately, the long term weather forecasts are not predicting a lot of rain – if this is Climate Change - It does not bode well for the future.

During the past year, in addition to the field maintenance, we have continued to clean and maintain the clubhouse and equipment to the best that our rapidly aging body's enable us to do in order to maintain the facility to the standard required under our licence with Wollongong Council.

I would like to pass on a big thank you to our Thursday Crew (aka Final Fifteen) – the motley crew is easy to get along with, particularly when everyone has an opinion on how to proceed. The crew is already missing our Maz – it is just not the same without her there to keep us focused and to maintain the decorum when the boys are “sharing coffee wisdom”. We will keep her memory alive in the next year – and we hope that we can support Steve and the Saywell family while she watches down upon us. Steve is an important member of the gang and has much expertise and knowledge to contribute. The remainder of the team comprises Ken and Anne Phillis (our devoted gardener), Pete McAndrew, Mick Walsh, Garth Doyle, Peter Towers, Barry Johnson, "Rangi" Allnutt, Terry Nutt, Al Potter, Mick Traynor, Graham MacDonald, Grahame Tresidder, Paul Griffiths, Graeme Wheeldon and Barry Aylett. Unfortunately 2 of our team have struggled health wise - Terry Chessor cannot make it as often and Brian Bradley is residing in care down at Bomaderry – we wish them both well - you are not forgotten boys.

I thank all the wives who send along morning tea for our in-depth coffee sessions and give thanks to our Canteen ladies and gents for a great job as well. It is great to work with a team that wants to help keep Shamrocks successful both on and off the field.

I will not be renominating for the position of grounds person and I wish my successor all the best. As a parting comment, the enormous workload that our field gets during the season is not conducive to maintaining a high quality pitch and I have recommended to the Committee that consideration needs to be given to the field as being a major asset dependent on significant funding each year. I think the club's future strategy needs to include:

- the possibility of an alternative training area.
- Installation of a tank water irrigation system
- sideline seating.

These projects require substantial planning by the Committee and funding. Government grants are always on offer for clubs such as ours to bid for –but they are not easy to win unless the preparatory work has been done by the Club and they only offset the full cost – we need to raise money to fund them. If we want to attract revenue-producing games and events to the ground to help sustain our funding and to help us remain as a major force in local rugby, we need to continue to plan ahead and to maintain the great work that our previous Committees have done to get us where we are.
