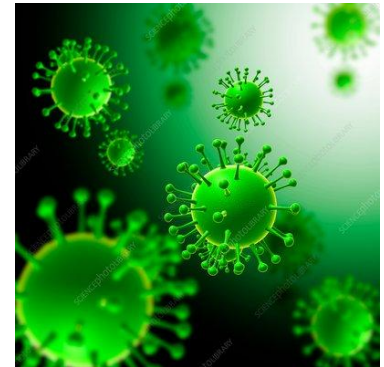

Treasurers Report 2020

A tough year for the club both on and off the field with the effects of the COVID 19 Pandemic meaning a disrupted and extremely shortened season year.

So revenue was down significantly, however the running costs to keep the club and facilities in good shape kept coming in as per normal, creating some real challenges for the club this year.

We have however come through this year in reasonable shape thanks to the amount of retained earnings the Club had set aside for such events.

Revenue though the Canteen was \$30,658 for the Seniors which was down from \$106,769, with the Juniors being \$717 down from \$5,666 last year.

There were no other significant sources of revenue for the club this year due to the impact of COVID.

We again this year hosted the Wollongong Dog Show. This is an annual event for us now and helps in our overall fundraising endeavours, which is reflected in the Canteen sales.

A big thanks to Ken and Anne and all the Canteen and BBQ staff for their efforts this year,

Thanks to the Thursday crew members again this year. While everything else in 2020 in respect of club activities were significantly reduced, the work that the Thursday crew had to do was still there for the large part and their work saves the club in costs every single year and is invaluable for us.

Also thanks to our Assistant Treasurer Terry Nutt for all of your hard work during the year to ensure our finances were properly managed, banked and reported. It has been a pleasure working with you again over the course of this year. You always make my job a lot easier through your diligence.

I will cover off in more detail the various expense related items, and revenue streams with their trends in the attached financial statements on a year on year comparison at our AGM, and will be happy to answer any questions arising out of these.

It was extremely disappointing that this year was thrown into chaos with the COVID pandemic. I am looking forward to a much more normal season in 2021. If we can continue to control COVID 19 in Australia as we have in 2020, hopefully, next year should shape up as another successful and enjoyable year for our club both on and off the field.

Grounds Person's Report

One of the few things positive that can be said of 2020 is that the reduced playing season has helped the playing field recover from the last few years of drought. Thanks to Slobber's donation of his large tank of rain water, we were able to transfer enough water from Bellambi during January to provide "first aid" watering of the playing surface to keep it alive until the rains came. We are now in the process of organising the hook up of our own water tank into the field piping system to help us offset any future dry periods that may result as our climate figures itself out without any help from the Government. Hopefully La Nina will help with the restoration process as we prepare for next season.

The Club's lease with Wollongong City Council was renewed for another 5 years, and the pressure is on to maintain the buildings in accordance with our lease requirements. The need for running repairs and maintenance are ever ongoing and while the "ageing" Thursday Crew have toiled well, new and "younger" faces will need to be recruited if the Club is to continue complying with the conditions that our lease imposes on us. It is getting harder to get up and down ladders, and the shovels, brooms, mowers and whipper-snippers move at slower speeds each year. Similarly, the building is getting older and little problems are starting to crop up. For example, issues have occurred with the fire detection panel and this may need to be replaced soon. Hence the ongoing need to do the work and raise the money to keep those Green teams on the paddock.

The Covid-19 restrictions were good for the grass but made Thursdays interesting with some of the social distancing requirements given a "Shamrocks" interpretation at times. Terry Nutt led from the front in the absence of an "appointed" Ground Co-Ordinator and one word from him and they all pleased themselves. The squad was capably backed up by Steve Saywell, who is the go-to man for technical issues, with assistance and advice from Micky Walsh, Grahame (the "Voice") Tresidder and Barry Aylett (on day release from Kiama). Mick & Denise Hyam when they weren't away destroying their 5th Wheeler, made the trip down from the Covid hot spot of Campbelltown without spreading the virus and Anne Phillis toiled away keeping the gardens look nice. Graeme Wheeldon, Mick Traynor and Graham MacDonald showed skill in sneaking in late and looking busy with an occasional visit from Huw "mullet" Thomas. Barry Johnson and Peter McAndrew have done a sterling job as the resident "sparkies" and Rod Mercer has hobbled in a couple of times to give them an extra opinion. Pete Towers may not have marked as many lines this year, but he still needs a tracker to map his wanderings around our pitch. Rangi Allnutt confirmed his role as "round up" man, while Al Potter still managed to get here after some running repairs from his friendly surgeon. The smokos were outstanding with Ken Phillis (Grounds person-in-waiting) and Paul Griffiths and credit must go to the cake-making skills of Pete McAndrew and the pikelets from Helen Aylett. Despite all of our suggestions, the Waratahs, Wallabies and Dragons all failed to take notice of this wise group's deliberations and paid the penalty on the scoreboards.

Senior Coach's Report

The 2020 season was the most challenging I have been involved in as either a player or a coach, however, in many ways it also one of the most rewarding. And so vastly different from the previous season where it was one celebration after another.

There is so much to be proud of for the playing and coaching group and committee alike. It's no secret that Covid-19 has upset so many people and their lives and has caused enormous hardship for many. Yet through all of that the one constant for players, coaches and officials was still being able to be connected to something bigger than yourself and still have opportunity to engage with your mates and work toward something positive.

While we, like most other clubs, had diminished numbers this year, for good reason, those that committed continued on, carrying the torch for the mighty Shamrock club. We began training in the last week of November in 2019 and continued to do so until we had our first competition game on Saturday 1st of August 2020, 19 weeks after the intended start of the Season. That's 36 weeks of pre-season before we had the opportunity to play (with the exception of the Waverly trial – not sure how we didn't become a Covid hotspot following that game and subsequent post-match celebration). While there was the odd training session where numbers were low we mostly had numbers in the high twenty's early thirty's for the two grades that ended up playing in the competition. An outstanding effort and a great display of just how committed our players are to playing for our great club. Staying motivated and committed amongst such enormous uncertainty is so impressive and I feel so privileged to have worked through all of that with the 2020 group of coaches, players and club people. And this is purely the reason why the toughest of seasons has also been the most rewarding and satisfying to have been a part of. Thanks to everyone who carved out success where there was little hope, it's greatly appreciated.

Our results on the park were also impressive as can be seen below. It's important to note that only two clubs played Avondale twice and only one, the mighty Shamrocks had to play them on their home turf twice. Further testament to the motivation and commitment of this group is the challenges we faced with the competition structure. After pushing for a better structure than a 10's comp thrown up by the district, all clubs settled on 9 rounds and first past the post to simply just ensure we got to play. Shortly after Uni (1st XV only) and Bowral pulled out of the competition leaving only 7 in the 1st XV and 8 in the 2nd XV. The reshuffle of the draw had us playing Avondale away both weeks 1 and 3, book ending a home game with Campbelltown which ended in a forfeit against us. Given we had 3 losses in the first 3 weeks we were out of the running to be first past the post at season end. However, this still did not deter our players from fronting up and continuing to be the best they could be. We might have been 4th on the table, however from my point of view we were the 2nd best team in the competition behind a dominant Avondale.

For those not close to the decision to not travel to Campbelltown, and costing us a forfeit, I still stand by that position. It was not the right thing to do, at that point, to travel into a known Covid hotspot for the sake of playing football. Player safety needed to be paramount and it is the players and their safety that we put first. Given Campbelltown's inflexibility around decisions regarding this game, it made our last game against them, on their turf, all the more satisfying when we belted them 43-7.
